#### Teachers' notes

The materials in this book were produced in order to meet a real need to find something at a very simple level that would encourage children to seek meaning in text, to classify, to sequence, to evaluate and to extend their language development generally. Somewhere along the way, it was to be hoped they might improve their overall reading ability, too !

This book is arranged in 5 sections, each containing 4 worksheets.

The sections are: Classification Picture completion Sequencing True or false Cloze

The worksheets were tried out with groups of mainstream infants, with slightly older pupils needing extra support in mainstream classes, and with the complete range of pupils in special schools. They were intended to be used as the culmination of a carefully prepared discussion, to which all pupils would be encouraged to contribute fully. Wherever possible, an activity such as drawing, cutting, sticking or colouring has been included and this has been successful in terms of avoiding areas where pupils already feel they are failing, and in helping to extend concentration span and develop manual skills. With adequate preparation and practice, it may be possible for pupils to finish the tasks independently and, used in this way, the materials could provide an assessment of how far the pupils have progressed in terms of autonomous learning skills.

This format will enable teachers to select areas in which pupils need more practice and to omit those where pupils are already proficient. The use of an interactive whiteboard will also promote group discussion. Sequencing and cloze often prove to be the areas which present the greatest problems, but obviously, individual needs will vary.

Finally, it should be stressed that the materials present only one facet of a reading programme, which, for pupils experiencing real difficulty, will also include work on discrimination, decoding, encoding and motor skills.

Thanks are due to Barbara Mitchelhill for her patient and careful editing, and to the many Hounslow teachers and pupils who have kindly tried the material in the classroom.
